

# Peer Mediation Development Coordinator



**We are looking for an experienced educator who can train adults and children in peer mediation.**

- Salary:** £28,476.80 (£35,596 pro rata 0.8FTE)

- Contract:** Part-time, one-year fixed term, January 2026-January 2027
- Hours:** Up to 28 hours per week. This is a four-day post
